Syracuse University students from all majors are trained and serve as tutors in local school settings while developing critical career skills. SULC is foundational to the Shaw Center's initiatives.

Shaw Center partners with campus units to ensure students have safe access to and from community sites. Seventy percent of student riders are completing academic placements. Thirty percent are doing extracurricular volunteering.

Engineering Ambassadors
