

## Applications sought for Robert B. Menschel Public Service Award

The Mary Ann Shaw Center for Public and Community Service (Shaw Center) administers the Robert B. Menschel Public Service Award. This award was established to honor Robert Menschel and to perpetuate his commitment to the not-for-profit world by supporting undergraduate internships at nonprofit organizations.

We encourage and invite undergraduate students who have secured an internship with a nonprofit organization for the Spring 2020 semester to apply for this \$1,500 award.

To be considered for the Robert B. Menschel Public Service Award, the applicant:

must be a matriculated student, in good standing, enrolled at Syracuse University; have an internship at a 501(c)(3) nonprofit, nongovernmental organization; submit all application materials before the deadline.

Deadline for applications is Friday, January 31, 2020.

Recipients will be notified by email in mid-February and funds will be released directly to student bursar accounts. A short reflection paper about the internship experience will be requested at the end of the semester and provided to the funder.
